Dear Dr. Cohon:

The Committee on Energy and Natural Resources will hold a hearing on S.J. Res. 34, a joint resolution approving the site at Yucca Mountain, Nevada, for the development of a repository for the disposal of high-level radioactive waste and spent nuclear fuel, pursuant to the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982.

On behalf of the Committee, I would like to invite you to testify at the hearing. The Committee is particularly interested in the Board's views on:

- (1) whether a permanent geologic repository can be built to manage spent nuclear fuel and high-level radioactive waste without harming the public health and safety or the environment;
- (2) whether there is any reason to believe that such a repository cannot safely be located at Yucca Mountain; and
- (3) whether sufficient technical information is or will be available to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to enable it to assess the safety and environmental impact of a repository at Yucca Mountain.

The hearing will be held on Thursday, May 23, 2002 at 9:30 a.m. The location of the hearing will be SD-366 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building.
