Program Priorities

- Yucca Mountain site characterization activities
- Evaluation of standardized and multi-purpose canister concepts
- Implementation of Secretary's guidance

FY 1994 Budget Request

- \$380 million
- Increased emphasis on funding for Yucca Mountain activities
- Decreased emphasis on a monitored retrievable storage facility and transportation
- Moved funding from East to West
- Continue effort to reduce overall cost of site characterization

Secretary's Guidance

- Create a Chief Scientist position for the Yucca Mountain Site Characterization Project
- Initiate negotiations with local governments of appropriate Payments Equal to Taxes
- Increase the involvement of the Nevada University
 System in the Yucca Mountain Project
- Develop a plan for broad public involvement on key issues
- Develop a proposal for revolving fund legislation

Areas of Further Evaluation

- 1998 waste acceptance requirement
- MRS siting activities
